

I William Jones a Commissioner duly sworn, under  
and by Virtue of an Act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> Years of the  
Reign of King William the fourth, entitled an Act to  
Amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Years  
of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth,  
providing for the Establishing Compositions for Tithes in  
Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent. —  
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all  
Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable with the Parish  
of Killeagh, in the County of Cork, do hereby Certify that the  
true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever  
within the said Parish is ~~eight hundred and fifty Pounds~~ <sup>eight hundred and fifty Pounds</sup> ~~and seventy four~~  
~~Pounds ten Shillings~~ <sup>and that the said sum of</sup>  
~~and seventy four Pounds ten Shillings~~ <sup>is due and payable to the Reverend Doctor Rich<sup>d</sup> Henry</sup>  
is due and payable to the Reverend Doctor Rich<sup>d</sup> Henry  
Proger as Rector of said Parish of Killeagh, as a Composition  
for all Tithes Claimable by him out of said Parish, and  
I do further Certify that the average price of Wheat being  
the Corn principally grown in that County during the period  
of seven Years ending the first November 1830 thirty is one  
Pound twelve Shillings & one half penny per Barrel. —  
given and in my hand at Killeagh this  
13<sup>th</sup> December 1833 Three
