

We Pierce Simon Creagh of Rathbane and Bryan Moran of Lahaney both in the County of
Blaw Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the
fourth year of the Reign of King George 4th Chapter 99 entitled an Act to provide for the
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and under and
by virtue of another Act made in the fifth year of the Reign of King George 4th Chap. 63
entitled an Act to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament for providing
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland to ascertain and fix a true and
just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of
Killeany in the Diocese of Killmore and County of Blaw do hereby certify that the true
and just amount of Compositions for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is
Twenty five pounds Sterling British by the year and that the said sum of Twenty
five pounds Sterling British is due and payable to the Rev^d Mark Cassidy as a
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish
of Killeany and we do further certify that the ~~same~~ composition do continue
unvaried for the term of Twenty One years from the first day of November next
and we do further certify that the average price of Oats being the corn principally
grown in said County of Blaw for the period of seven years ending on the first
day of November 1824 is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing sted. per Barrel
Dated this 23 day of October 1830 & thirty
