duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the  
fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to  
provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a  
limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all  
Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killyedy  
in the County of Limerick, Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Five  
Hundred and twenty five pounds Sterling by the year, the whole of which  
Sum of Five hundred and twenty five pounds Sterling is due and payable  
to the Rev. Edward Genally Clark, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable  
by him as Rector of the said Parish.

And We do further Certify that the average price of Oats, being  
the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years  
ending on the thirty first day of October One thousand Eight Hundred  
and twenty One inclusive is fifteen Shillings two pence <sup>Chaffing</sup> for Barrels.
