Majesty King William the Fourth intituled an  
act to amend three acts passed respectively in the  
Fourth Fifth and in the seventh and eighth  
years of the reign of His late Majesty King George  
the Fourth providing for the Establishing of  
compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make  
such compositions permanent to ascertain and  
fix a true and just composition for all Tithes  
arising growing & payable within the Parish of  
Killeglan in the County of Meath do hereby  
certify that the true and just amount of  
composition for all Tithes whatever within the  
said Parish is Fifty Four pounds by the year which  
sum is due and payable to the Reverend Robert Norman  
as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as  
Rector and Vicar of said Parish And I do further  
certify, that the average price of wheat being the corn  
principally grown in such County for the period of  
seven years ending on the first day of November one  
thousand eight hundred and thirty is one pound  
twelve shillings and ten pence halfpenny per barrel  
Dated this 20<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1833
