Mr. James Casey Commissioners duly appointed and sworn
Under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of
the Reign of King George the fourth, entitled an Act to
provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding
or payable within that part of the Parish of Killclan in the
County of Wick which is united to the Parish of Jimclia

Do hereby Certify that the true and
just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
that Part of the said parish is Two hundred and Seventeen Pounds
ten shillings by the Year, of which sum of Two hundred and Seventeen
Pounds ten shillings, One third part is due and payable to the
Rev. Latham Caddington as Composition for the Tithes claim-
able by him as Clerical Incumbent of that Part of said Parish
and Two thirds is due and payable to Sir Richard Steel Baronet
as owner of said Two thirds.

And we do further Certify that the average
price of Wheat the Corn principally grown in said County for
the period of Seven years ending on the first day of November
One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty one viz One Pound
fifteen shillings and eight Pence Half penny per Barrel,
