

Arthur Moore Mosse having been duly appointed and  
sworn Commissioner under and by virtue of an act made  
in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> years of the reign of King William 4<sup>th</sup> Chapter 119  
entitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the  
4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> years of the reign of his late Majesty King George  
4<sup>th</sup> providing for the Establishment of Composition of Tythes in  
Ireland and to make such composition permanent  
(16 August 1832) to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition  
for all Tythes arising - Growing, yielding or payable within  
the Parish of Kellerny in the Queens County - Do Certify  
that the true and just amount of Composition for all  
Tythes whatever within said Parish is Tythes Pence  
by the year and that the said sum of Tythes Pence  
is payable to the Reverend Joshua Anderson as a composition  
for all Tythes claimed by him as Rector of said Parish

And I do further Certify that the average price  
of wheate being the flour principally grown  
in said County for the period of seven years  
ending 1<sup>st</sup> November 1830 is one pound twelve  
Shillings and one Halfpenny - Per Bannell
