certify that the true & just amount of composition for  
all tithes whatsover within the said Parish is One  
hundred & thirtyn pounds, twelve shillings & ten  
pence 10<sup>s</sup> by the year which sum is due & pay-  
able to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Geo<sup>r</sup> Woods of Newtown as Rector & Vicar  
of said Parish, & we do further certify that the aver-  
age price of oats being the most principal grower  
in such Parish for the period of seven years ending  
on the first day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1821 is £0-15-2<sup>h</sup> Dated this  
9<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1824
