Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent & to ascertain and fix  
a true Composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within  
the Parish of Millinacole in the Diocese of Armagh and County of  
Down do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Compositions  
for all tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is two Hundred and  
forty one pounds Eighteen Shillings and three pence Sterling &  
by the year are due and Payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Joseph Wright as a  
Composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of said  
Parish

And I do further certify that the Average price of Wheat  
being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period ending  
1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1835 is one pound twelve Shillings & one half pence  
per Acre
