Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by  
virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign  
of King George the fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide  
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded,  
or payable within the Parish of Killiney in the County  
of Dublin do hereby certify that the true and just  
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within  
the said Parish of Killiney is One hundred and twenty  
six Pounds sixteen shillings by the year. of which  
sum of One hundred and twenty six pounds sixteen  
shillings Two third parts namely eighty four pounds  
ten shillings and eight pence are due and payable to  
the Hon<sup>ble</sup> and Right Rev<sup>d</sup>. Charles Lord Bishop of Kildare  
as a Composition for <sup>the</sup> tithes claimable by him as Dean  
of Christ Church Dublin, and One third part namely  
Forty two pounds five shillings and four pence is due  
and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>. Charles Lindsay Clerk as a  
Composition for the tithes claimable by him as Perpetual  
Curate of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average price of  
Wheat being the Corn principally grown in  
such County for the period of seven years ending on  
the first day of November 1824 pursuant  
to a Schedule furnished ~~shillings~~ by the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup>  
Henry Goulburn Chief Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of  
Ireland is one Pound eighteen shillings and eight  
pence halfpenny per Barrel.
