

I, *Joseph Sandford* Commissioner,
duly appointed and sworn under, and by virtue of an
Act made in the second and third year of *William*
the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three Acts
passed respectively in the 4th, 5th, and 7th & 8th
years of the reign of his late Majesty *King George*
the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Com-
positions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Com-
positions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all TITHES arising, growing,
yielded or payable, within the Parish of *Killencorley*

in the County of *Wexford*
do hereby certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
Parish, is *One hundred & Ninety* Pounds

Shillings and Pence by the year, of which
Sum of *£190* Pounds *Shillings*
and Pence, are due and payable to the

following persons, as a Composition for the Tithe
claimable by them viz:—

To Mr. Henry Murphy as Lessee of
Hamilton Knox Grogan Morgan Esq. Lay Impropriator. The amount of average
for the seven years preceding Nov. 1830 being £10.5.11½. In consideration of the sum
agreed to be paid during the five first years from which the average is taken being under
the value, and thereof an inadequate compensation for the Tithes of said Parish
I add £28.14.1 amount of composition is thereof £190.

And I do further certify that the average price of
Oats being the Corn principally grown
in such county, for the period of seven years, ending
on the *1st* day of *November* 1830 — is *£0.12.11½*
shillings per barrel, as extracted from the *Dublin*
Gazette. Dated this 28th day of September—1833.
