

We John Allman of Tyrconnel and John Burke of Norman grove in the County of Galway Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled an act to provide for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the parish of Killenhy in the County of Galway do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish is ~~ninety eight pounds and six pence Sterling~~ ^{by the year} of which sum of ninety ~~eight~~ ^{eight} pounds and six pence Sterling forty two pounds Sterling are due and payable to George Dwyer as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of said parish and his Successors, Twenty one pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of Clonfert and Kilimacduagh and his Successors, Twenty Seven pounds Thirteen ^{and six pence} Shillings Sterling are due and payable to John Burke and his Successors as vicar of said parish Seven pounds seven Shillings Sterling are due and payable to Mr. Hood and his Successors as Dean of Kilimacduagh, and we do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 one is ten Shillings and six pence by the Barrel Signed Sealed and delivered this twenty second day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty six
