

I *George Breton* Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under, and by virtue of an Act made in the 2nd and 3rd year of **WILLIAM the FORTH**, "entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in 4th 5th and the 7th and 8th years of the Reign of his late Majesty **KING GEO. the FORTH**, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of *Tullish* in the County of *Wexford* do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is $\text{£}164-2-3$ Pounds by the year, of which Sum of *One Hundred and Sixty four Pounds* *Two Shillings & three Pence* are due and payable to the following Persons as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by them viz

And I do further certify that the average price of *Oats* being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven years, ending on the *first* day of *November* 1830 is $12-11\frac{1}{2}$ *Shillings* per Barrel. as
