I Mr. Stoddart of Danganally in the County of
Clare duly appointed and sworn, under and by Virtue
of an Act made in the seventh year of the reign of his late
Majesty King Geo. the fourth. Entitled an Act to provide
for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in
Ireland for a limited time - and by Virtue of an
Act made in the second and third years of the reign
of his present Majesty King Will^m the fourth. Entitled
an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the
fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the
reign of his late Majesty King Geo. the fourth, providing for
the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland
and to make such Compositions permanent -
Do ascertain and give a true and just composition
for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the parish of Killoe in the County of Clare
Do hereby Certify that the true and just composition
for all tithes whatever, within the said parish is
Two hundred and Eighty four pounds 8s by the year
of which sum of two hundred and eighty four pounds
the sum of One hundred and twenty four pounds 8s
are due and payable to the Rev. James Martin as
Rector of the said parish, or owner of the Vicarage of the
said parish, or owner of the Vicarage of the
said parish, being the average sum paid, given or adjudged for
seven years preceding the first day of Nov. 1830
taken from his tithes books - and that the sum
of One hundred and twenty eight pounds, two
shillings, and six pence is being the average sum
paid, given, or adjudged for the period of seven years
preceding the first day of Nov. 1830 carefully taken
from the tithes books of James Greene Collector
