

To the Books of James Greene Collector of tithes
in the aforesaid parish of Killofin to Richd. Barclay Esq.
who is the deputy of Andrew Scott Esq. the Lay Proprietor
-master of tithes in said parish - And as the
aforesaid sum of ten hundred and thirty eight pounds
two Shillings and nine pence does not appear to be a
just composition for the aforesaid St. Scott - I consider
it just to add the further sum of twenty one pounds
seventeen Shill. and three pence by the year, on the
following grounds, that the aforesaid James Greene
made considerable reductions in most cases when
settling with the parishioners, and that some of those
reductions arose from favours bestowed on said
Greene, these are my grounds, and reasons for adding
to the average amount the sum of twenty one pounds
seventeen Shill. and three pence by the year, making
in all ten hundred and sixty pounds by the year
due and payable to Andrew Scott Esq. or his deputy
Richd. Barclay Esq. as Lay Proprietor -
And I do further certify that the average price of
Oats, being the corn principally sown in the County
and paid for the periods of seven years ending
the first day of Nov. 1830 is twelve Shillings and
seven pence half penny in pence, given under my
hand the 9 day of Oct. 1833
