

OATH OF COMMISSIONER,

To be taken before any Justice of the Peace of any County in which the Parish shall be situate, in which such Commissioner shall be appointed to act.

I William Clark of Wiltshire in the County of Luton

do Swear that I will faithfully, impartially, and honestly, according to the best of my skill and ability, execute and perform the Powers and Authorities vested and reposed in me as a Commissioner in the Parish of Pull Kennedy by virtue of an Act passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time," and by virtue of an Act passed in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," and also by an Act passed in the Second Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled, "An Act to authorize the immediate Distribution of a Portion of the Fund applicable to the Relief of Persons entitled to certain Arrears of Tithe Compositions under an Act of the last Session of Parliament, to abolish Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to substitute Rent-charges in lieu thereof; and for other Purposes;" according to the Directions of the said Acts, and according to equity and good conscience, and without favour or affection, prejudice or malice, to any Person or Persons whomsoever.
