 Tithes in Ireland to ascertain and fix a limited
 just Composition for all Tithes arising, Growing, yielded
 or payable within the Parish of Killoonohaw in the
 Diocese of Kilmore and County of Clare do hereby
 Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
 for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is
 Eighty two pounds ten Shillings 11^d British by
 the year and that the said Sum of Eighty two pounds
 ten Shillings 11^d is due and payable to the Rector
 John Westropp as a Composition for the Tithes claimable
 by him as Rector & Vicar of said Parish of Killoonohaw
 and we do further Certify that the said Composition
 do continue unchanged for the term of twenty one
 Years from the first day of May next and we do
 further Certify that the Average price of Oats being
 the Corn principally grown in said County of Clare
 for the period of Seven Years ending on the
 first day of November 10th is fifteen
 Shillings and two pence farthing per
 Bushell ^{Bushell} ^{Dated this} 10th day of
 November 1827 Sworn
