

We, John Allman of Eyecourt, and John Connelly of Cargin, in the County of Galway Esquires, Commissioners, duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth, intituled an Act, to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killora, in the County of Galway, and Diocese of Kilmacduagh. Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and fifty seven pounds Sterling, by the year, of which sum of One Hundred and fifty seven pounds Sterling - Seventy nine pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Rev. Edward Hartigan, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish and his Successors - Fifty pounds Sterling are due and payable to Robert King as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Archdeacon of said Parish and his Successors - Twenty eight pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Bishop of Clonfert and his Successors, and that the same shall continue for twenty one years from the first day of November next without alteration &c. We do further Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the 1st day of November 1821 one - is ten Shillings and Six pence by the Barrel -
