

We, John Allman of Eyecourt, and John Connolly of Cargin in the County of Galway Esquires, Commissioners duly appointed and Sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth, intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes whatever, arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Killora, in the County of Galway and Diocese of Kilmacduagh - do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and fifty seven pounds Sterling, by the year of which sum of One Hundred and fifty seven pounds Ster. Seventy nine pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Rev. Edward Hartigan, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Rector of said Parish and his Successors. Fifty pounds Sterling are due and payable to Robert King, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Archdeacon of said Parish and his Successors. Twenty eight pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Bishop of Clonfert and his Successors.

We do further Certify that the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven years, ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 one - is ten Shillings and Six pence by the Barrell.
