We Henry Fleury and Michael Dobbyn Esq^r Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act passed in the fourth year of George the fourth Chap: 99 Intituled an act to provide for the establishing compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for the entire tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kil St. Nicholas in the Diocese of Waterford and County of Waterford do certify that at a special vestry held in the Parish Church of Kil St. Nicholas on the 29th May last it was then and there agreed by and between the said special vestry and the Rev^d John B. Palliser Rector and Vicar of the said Parish that the sum of Two hundred and eight pounds Twelve shillings and three pence $\frac{1}{4}$ British should stand and be a just and fair composition for the entire Tithes of the said Parish of Kil St. Nicholas annually for the space of twenty one years from the above date invariable without reference to the average price of corn and we find that the said sum of Two hundred and eight pounds Twelve shillings and three pence $\frac{1}{4}$ British are due and payable to the said Rev^d John B. Palliser and his successors as Rectors and Vicars of the Parish of Kil St. Nicholas Annually payable half yearly - viz. Every first day of May and first day of November
