O'Hara, commissioners duly appointed and sworn under, and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth (entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to wit in and for a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Milloran in the County of Tyrone do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatsover within said Parish is three hundred and thirty two pounds by the year of which sum of three hundred and thirty two pounds the sum of one hundred and nineteen pounds are due and payable to the very said the Dean of Achonry as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish, and the sum of one hundred and thirteen pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Archdeacon Joseph Parslyte the Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the Period of seven years ending the 1st Day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty one is fifteen Shillings and two pence the 2^d Barrel given under our Hands this twenty ninth Day of October 1824 four
