

We John Surin and Charles H. O'Hara Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth, (entitled an Act to provide for establishing of composition for Tithes for a limited Period) and amended by an Act made in the fifth year of the Reign of the said King Chap: 63 - to ascertain and fix a true composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Hilloran in the County of Sligo. Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish, is three Hundred and thirty seven pounds by the year, of which Sum of three Hundred and thirty seven pounds, the Sum of one Hundred and twenty one Pounds ten Shillings are due and payable to the very Rev^d the Dean of Achany, as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the Parish, the said Sum of one Hundred and twenty one pounds ten Shillings, being a moiety of the Tithes, accruing and payable by and out of the following twenty one Town Lands - viz. Cabragh, Cappagh, Carragh, Carrowestuvane being one quarter of Clara, Carrowganon, Carrowhamth, Feingrove part of do, Carrowloghane, Carrow Carrick & Carrowmullin, Carrow-nebonagh, Carrownaclogh, Carrownaska, Coolany, Creevane, Guntaturan, Knockadoo, Knockatolane, Rathbaron, Rathoury, Roadstown or Ballinsally, Seemys, and Shanough. And the Sum of ^{two} Hundred and fifteen Pounds ten Shillings is due and payable to Archdeacon ^{Joseph} Puschoyke the Vicar of the said
