

We Thomas Hackett & William Moton, Commissioners duly appointed & sworn, under & by virtue of an Act made in the fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited Time" to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killeenan in the County of Roscommon. So hereby certify, that the true & just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred & one pounds, seven Shillings & eight pence Sterling, by the Year: And that the whole of the said sum of One Hundred & one pounds, seven Shillings & eight pence Sterling is due & payable to The Venerable, Archdeacon John Oldfield, or Rector of the said Parish & to his Successors the Rectors of the said Parish: And we do further certify, that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven Years ending on the first day of Nov^r 1827, is Fifteen Shillings & two pence farthing & a Barrel is

At a special Vestry held in the Church of Killeenan, on Thursday the twenty fifth day of October 1827 twenty seven, of which due notice was given, for the purpose of taking into consideration the Certificate signed by the Commissioners for the amount of Composition in lieu of tithes in the Parish of Killeenan, Diocese of Elphin: The said Certificate was then & there approved of, for the amount of One Hundred & one pounds, seven Shillings & eight pence per annum: to be paid for twenty one years from the first day of November next ensuing, to the Venerable John O. Oldfield Archdeacon of Elphin, & to his Successors, Incumbents of said Parish.
