Whereas a Certificate for the Parish of Killybeg in the County of Kerry and Diocese of Ardara and Aghadoe was lodged with the Register of the said Diocese, and appears and is entered in the Registry of the said Diocese, in the words and Figures following to wit I John Paendergast Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third Years of the Reign of his present Majesty King William the fourth intitled An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth Years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes growing arising yielded, or payable within the Parish of Killybeg in the County of Kerry Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish of Killybeg, is Three hundred and ninety two pounds six Shillings and two Pence Sterling British Currency, by the year which Sum of Three hundred, and ninety two pounds six Shillings and two Pence Sterling is due and payable to the Rev. Richard Plummer, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him, as Rector and Vicar of said Parish And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of Seven Years, ending on the first Day of November, One thousand Eight hundred and thirty, is One pound twelve Shillings and a halfpenny per Barrel Dated this 27 Day of September 1834 and four John Paendergast, Commissioner for the Parish of Killybeg And whereas two several Appeals, against the said Certificate, one from William Brasie of Ardara Abbey, in the County of Kerry and the other from the Rev. Richard Plummer Rector and Incumbent of the said
