


Said Parish, having been duly made, and Notice of such Appeals
having been duly given We did by an Order of the Twenty ninth
Day of January last appoint Wednesday the Eighteenth Day of
February instant, for hearing the Parties concerned in the Matter
of the said Appeals, of which Order for Hearing due Notice was
given to the Said Parties, and the Said Appeals, having this
Day that is to say Wednesday the Eighteenth Day of February 1835
come on to be heard before Us Thomas Earl of Haddington, Lord
Lieutenant General, and General Governor of Ireland, in Council in
the presence of Counsel, learned in the Law appearing on behalf of
the said Appellants respectively, and therupon the Said Appeals
and Certificate and the Matter thereof, having been heard and
considered by us the said Thomas Earl of Haddington, Lord
Lieutenant General and General Governor of Ireland in Council
It is this Day that is to say Wednesday the Eighteenth Day
of February 1835 Ordered by Us the said Thomas Earl of
Haddington Lord Lieutenant General, and General Governor of
Ireland, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Privy
Council of Ireland, That the said Certificate of the 27th
September 1824, be, and the same is hereby annulled; and
that the Entry thereof in the Registry of the Diocese be annulled
accordingly And it is further Ordered, that the Certificate of
Imposition, for the Tithes, of the said Parish sets forth in the said
Appeal, and appearing therefrom to be dated the 25th of October
1824 shall stand confirmed.
