

I John Miller Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under
and by virtue of an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of King George
the fourth, entitled 'An Act to provide for the establishing of composi-
tions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time' and by virtue of an Act
passed in the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty King
William the fourth, entitled 'An Act to amend three Acts passed respec-
tively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh, and eighth years of the
reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the
establishing of compositions of tithes in Ireland, and to make such
compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just
composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable
within the Parish of Millbeggs in the County of Donegal, do hereby
certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes
whatsoever in said Parish (including all the ^{tithes of the P. M.} Glebes in said Parish) is
Three hundred Pounds Sterling by the year, which sum of three hundred
Pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Reverend George Stewart
as a composition for all tithes claimable by him as Rector of said
Parish, And I do further certify that the average price of Cattle
being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period
of seven years ending the first day of November 1830 shall be
Eleven Shillings and two pence halfpenny British per barrel of
fourteen Stone, given under my hand this 16th day of
September 1839. Truly three
