appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made  
in the Tenth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled  
an Act to provide for establishing a Composition for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited term "to ascertain and fix a true and just  
composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within  
the Parish of Kilmachalea in the County of Cork do hereby  
certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all  
Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Five Hundred and  
ninety Pounds by the Year, of which sum Two Hundred and  
ninety five Pounds are due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Charlton  
Brisson as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as  
Vicar of said Parish and One Hundred and seventy five  
Pounds sixteen shillings and eight pence half penny to Rev<sup>d</sup> Edward  
St. Lawrence as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him  
as Archdeacon and Ninety nine Pounds five shillings and  
six pence are due and payable to Mr. Donnan as a Composi-  
tion as holder of the Impropriate Tithes of said Parish and  
Nineteen Pounds sixteen shillings and nine pence half penny  
are due and payable to Mr. Sullivan as a Composition  
as holder of the Rectory Tithes of said Parish  
Given under our hands this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October 1828 eight
