

Carl Courts^C By the Justices assigned to keep the Peace in and for
East Riding the County of York at a General Quarter Sessions held
at York in the East Riding of the County of York on the sixteenth
day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
fifty four,

Whereas due notice of application having
been first given at the times and in the manner directed by the Statute
in that case made and provided by the Right Honourable John Broughton
Earl Bishop of Rochester Mountfort Longfield Esquire Francis Wye Esq.
and Florence M^r Carter Esq^r four persons owners of Land in the
Parish of Kilwinnington in the Diocese of Elgin Division of
Middleton and East Riding of the County of York each charged with
the annual payment of Three pounds and upwards in respect
of the Rent charges payable in lieu of the Compositions for Tithes
within the said Parish made by the certificate of Walter Sutrey Esquire
bearing date the fifteenth day of January one thousand eight
hundred and thirty four and in pursuance of the Statutes in that
case made and provided whereby the gross amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatever in the said Parish was certified to be one
thousand and twelve pounds fifteen shillings Sterling, the said
four persons made application in writing to the Justices of the
Peace at the Quarter Sessions above mentioned to have the average
price of wheat being the grain in the Certificate mentioned for the
preceding seven years in the Statutes in that behalf mentioned
enquired and ascertained in order that the said Compositions for
Tithes and the Rent charges in lieu thereof might be diminished
according to such average price as compared with the price of one
pound twelve shillings and one half penny being the price of Wheat
as set forth in said Certificate, And whereas the Reverend William
Rogers Vicar of the said Parish and the Ecclesiastical Commis-
sioners of Ireland having appeared before the said Justices at
such Quarter Sessions and said Notice of Application Certificate
and the average price of Wheat as advertised in the Dublin Gazette
for the said period of seven years having been proved.

With the said Justices do ascertain from
the said Gazette that the average price of Wheat for the said
period of seven years is one pound seven shillings and three
half pence for each barrel of Twenty Strid and the said Justices
do
