 sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the
 reign of King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the better
 -ments of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for limited time to ascertain
 and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded
 or payable within the Parish of Kilmacduagh in the County of Galway
 do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all
 Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is one Hundred pounds Sterling by the
 Year - and one Hundred and Thirty pounds British by the Year and that
 such Composition shall continue to be levied for the term of Twenty-
 one Years from the first day of May one Thousand eight Hundred and Twenty
 six of which sums of one Hundred pounds Sterling ^{or 192. 16. 12 British} and one Hundred
 and Thirty pounds British the sum of one Hundred pounds Sterling is due
 and payable to the Very Reverend Richard Wood S. D. as a composition for the
 Tithes claimable by him as Dean and Rector of the said Parish and the
 sum of seventy pounds British is due and payable to the Reverend Alexander
 McAuley as treasurer of said Parish and the sum of Sixty pounds British
 is due and payable to the Revd Wm. Smith as Curate of the said Parish
 and we do further Certify that the average price of Wheat being the Com
 principally grown in such County for the period of seven Years ending
 on the first day of November one Thousand eight Hundred and
 Twenty one is one pound eight shillings and eight pence
 halfpenny per Barrel Dated this fifth day of December
 one Thousand eight Hundred and Twenty five
