 to ascertain and fix a true and just composition  
 for all Tithes having growing quitted and payable  
 within the Parish of Billmearc in the County of Wexford  
 do hereby certify that the true and just amount  
 of composition for all Tithes whatever within  
 said Parish to run from the twenty of June ending on the first of May 1835  
 is Fifty seven Pounds eight Shillings and three half pence  
 and that by the year of which term  
 forty two pounds and three pence three farthings  
 are due and payable to The Rev<sup>d</sup> Richard  
 Waddy M.A. as a composition for the Tithes Church  
 by him as Vicar of said Parish and the sum of  
 sixteen Pounds sixteen Shillings and three farthings  
 is due and payable to the Earl of Pembroke  
 Baron of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish And
