

I Nicholas Lett Commissioner duly appointed  
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed  
in the second ~~and third~~ years of the reign of his  
present Majesty King William the fourth  
entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed  
respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the  
seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late  
Majesty King George the fourth providing  
for the establishing of compositions for Tithes  
in Ireland and to make such compositions perma-  
nent to ascertain and fix a true and just com-  
position for all Tithes arising growing yielded or  
payable within the Parish of Billmarrow in  
the County of Wickford: Do hereby certify that the  
true and just amount of composition for all  
Tithes whatsover within the said Parish is one  
hundred and twenty pounds, eight shillings sterling  
by the year, which sum of £120.8. sterling is due  
and payable to the Vicar Thomas Gore as a com-  
position for Tithes claimable by him as Rector  
of the said Parish of Billmarrow.

And I do further certify that the average price of  
Oats being the corn principally grown in said  
County for the period of seven years ending on  
the 1st day of November 1830 is twelve shillings  
and seven pence halpenny per barrel.
