King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and  
to make such Compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition  
for all Tithes and ~~g.~~ growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Kilmee in the  
County of Wick and Wex, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Seven hundred and  
Forty pounds by the year of which sum of seven hundred and Forty pounds one half  
part is due and payable to Daniel McCarty Esq. as a Composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him as Lessee of the Vicarual Tithes of said Parish and one other half  
part is due and payable to Arthur Duggen Esq. as a Composition for the Tithes claimable  
by him as Receiver under the Court of Chancery to the Impropriate Tithes of said Parish  
demised by the Right Honble Lord Donoughmore Lay Impropriator to the late Henry  
Duggen Esq. And I do further certify that the average price of Oats being the  
corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending  
on the first day of November Eighteen hundred and thirty is twelve shillings and
