We Sir Samuel O'Malley Bart. and Geo. Clendinning Esquires  
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act  
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the 4<sup>th</sup> Entitled  
"An Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for  
all tithes arising growing payable or payable within the Parish of Kilmeena  
in the County of Mayo Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of  
Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is Three  
Hundred and Fifty Pounds Sterling by the year of which sum of Three  
Hundred and Fifty Pounds, the sum of Three Hundred and nine pounds  
twelve shillings and ten pence Sterling is due and payable to the Reverend  
John Galbraith as a Composition for the tithes claimable by him as  
Rector and Vicar of the said Parish — the sum of Thirty one Pounds  
ten shillings Sterling is due and payable to The Honorable & Venerable  
Charles Le Poer French Doctor in Divinity as a Composition for the  
parts or proportion of said tithes claimable by him as Prebendary  
of Taldown and the sum of Eight Pounds, seventeen shillings and eight pence  
is due and payable to the Reverend James Drume as a Composition for the  
parts or proportion of said tithes claimable by him as Prebendary of Killebegs  
And We do further Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn  
principally grown in such County for the period of seven years  
ending on the first day of November 1821, is fourteen shillings per  
Barrel being equivalent to fifteen shillings and two pence at present  
Given under our hands this Twenty fourth day of October 1829 twenty nine
