

We John Low and Whillow Wilson Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled; "An Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Milmeban in the County of Meath, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Twenty five pounds by the year. Of which sum of Two Hundred and Twenty five pounds Two Ninth parts are due and payable to the Marquis of Drogheda or his Representatives as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish and seven Ninth parts are due and payable to the Reverend St George Caulfield Irvine the Vicar of the said Parish And we do further certify that the average price of oats, being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One Thousand eight hundred and Twenty one is Fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel —
