I John Kildel, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth Intituled, "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh & eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent (11th August 1832)" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilnichael in the County of Cork, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Compositions for all Tithes, whatever, within the said

Parish is Nine Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds Eleven Shillings and Ten pence viz, by the year, of which sum of Nine Hundred Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings and Ten pence, the sum of Six Hundred and Ninety two Pounds Six Shillings and two Pence is due and payable to the Rev. Rich^d S. Rothe, Rector of one Part & Vicar of the other part of said Parish; this proportion of the Tithes has been already compounded for agreeably to Certificate, dated 29th April 1826 (Ses) and corresponding appointment (both of which are deposited in the Registry Office of Diocese of Cork). The Impropriate remainder of the aforesaid sum of Nine Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings and Ten pence; that is to say the sum of Two Hundred and Seventy three Pounds Five Shillings & Eight Pence is due and payable to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire as Lay Impropriator of the Rectorial Tithes of that part of said Parish, whereof the Rev^d Mr. Rothe is Vicar.

And I do further certify, that the average price of wheat, during the seven years ended 1st Nov^r 1831 was one pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny per Barrel, and that the price of Oats during same period was Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence half penny per Barrel. wheat and Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County of Cork.
