

# Parish of Kilmichael

I John Keed, Commissioner, duly appointed & sworn, under the virtue of an Act made in the Second & Third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, Intituled, "An Act to Amend three Acts" "pass'd respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in the Seventh and "Eighth years of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, "providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in "Ireland & to make such Compositions Permanent, 10<sup>th</sup> Aug<sup>th</sup> 1832" to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielded or payable within the parish of Kilmichael in the County of Cork, do hereby certify, that the true & just

Total Amount of Composition for all Tithes, whatevver within the said Parish is Nine Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings & Ten Pence Sterling, by the year; Of which sum of Nine Hundred & Sixty Five Pounds Eleven Shillings, and Ten Pence, the sum of Six Hundred & Ninety two Pounds Six Shillings & Two Pence is due & payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Rich<sup>d</sup> J. Roche the Rector of one part & Vicar of the other part of said Parish. This proportion of the Tithes has been already compounded for as appears by Certificate dated 29<sup>th</sup> April 1830, & corresponding appointment, both deposited in the Registry Office of the Diocese of Cork. The remainder of the aforesaid sum of Nine Hundred & Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings & Ten Pence that is to say, the sum of Two Hundred & Seventy three Pounds, Five Shillings & Eight Pence is due & payable to His Grace, the Duke of Devonshire, the Lay Proprietor of the Rectorial Tithes of that part of the Parish, whereof the Rev<sup>d</sup> Mr. Roche is Vicar.

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat during the Seven years, ended 1<sup>st</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1830 was One pound Twelve Shillings, and One half penny per Barrel; and that the average price of Oats during same period was Twelve Shillings & Eleven pence half penny per Barrel. Wheat & Oats being the Corn principally grown in the said County of Cork.
