I John Kidd duly appointed and sworn, Commissioner, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth Intituled "An Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively" "in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the" "Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for" "the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to" "make such Compositions permanent (10th August 1832)." to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilmichael, in the County of Cork, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said

£965.11.10 } Parish is Nine Hundred & Sixty Five Pounds Eleven Shillings and Ten Pence by the Year. Of which sum of Nine Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings, and Ten Pence Sterling, the sum

£692.6.2 } of Six Hundred & Ninety two Pounds six Shillings and two Pence is due and payable to the Rev^d Rich^d S. Rothe, Rector of one part & Vicar of the other part of said Parish; the aforesaid proportion of the Tithes having been previously compounded for, agreeably to certificate dated 29th April 1826 (sic) and corresponding Applotment both of which are lodged in the Registry Office of the Diocese of Cork. & the remainder of the aforesaid sum of Nine Hundred & Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings, and Ten Pence Stg; that is to say, the sum

£273.5.8 } of Two Hundred and Seventy three Pounds Five Shillings and Eight Pence is due and payable to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire as Lay Impropriator of the Rectorial Tithes of that part of said Parish, whereof the Rev^d Mr. Rothe (above named) is Vicar.

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat during the seven years ended 1st Nov^r 1830 was One Pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny $\frac{1}{2}$ Barrel, and that the price of Oats during same period was Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence $\frac{1}{2}$ Barrel; wheat and Oats being the Corn principally grown in said County of Cork.
