I James Brassington Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the reign of King William the 4th intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilmoon in the County of Meath do hereby Certify that the true and just Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one Hundred and forty six pounds by the year which sum is due and payable to the Rev^d William Coddington as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of said Parish, In which amount is included the sum of Thirteen pounds five Shillings over and above the amount of the average paid agreed for, or adjudged to be paid for the seven years ended November 1830, This addition I considered it my duty to make under the authority of the 16th Section of 4th George the 4th cap: 99, In consequence of my having ascertained the quantity of Tithable matter grown within the Parish, for which there was not sufficient satisfaction rendered. The former Rector who received the Tithes for the years 1824 & 1825 being a man of Property and not in the habit of asserting his rights from the year 1827 to 1830 inclusive the living being under Sequestration, I have received evidence which proved to me that the Sequestrator had not received the Value which appears evidently to have—
