

We Ralph Dudgeon And James W. Cullagh
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by
virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of
King George the fourth entitled an Act to provide
for the establishing a Composition for Tithes in Ireland
for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just
Composition for all Tithes Arising growing Yielded or
payable within the Parish of Killmore in the County
of Monaghan do hereby Certify that a Special Vestry
held in the Parish Church of Killmore on the 20th
day of March 1825 under the Lord Lieutenant's
Warrant for holding the same, that the Reverend
George Hay Schomberg Rector of Said Parish having
offered to Said Vestry to take the sum of Three hundred
and Ten pounds per annum in lieu of all Tithes
due or payable out of same and having procured the
Lord Bishop of Clogher's assent to the same, And
that the Said Vestry duly assembled unanimously agreed
to the same, and that the said sum of Three Hundred &
Ten pounds per annum be paid to the said Reverend
George Hay Schomberg or his Successors for the Space of
of Twenty one Years from the first day of May 1825
by two half yearly payments on every first day of November
and first day of May in every Year during Said period
in lieu of all Tithes arising growing Yielded or payable
out of Said Parish and that such Composition shall
be inviolable for the Space of twenty One Years and
shall not be subject to any Variation in the amount thereof
whatever the price of Corn may be —
