

I John Anderson Commissioner
 being duly appointed and Sworn (under and by virtue
 of an act made in the Second and Third years of the Reign
 of King William the Fourth) entitled an Act to amend Three
 Acts, passed respectively, in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh
 and Eighth years of the Reign, of his late Majesty, King George
 the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for
 Tithes, in Ireland: and to make such composition perma-
 -nent.) to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for
 all Tithes arising, growing, ~~vested~~, or payable within the
 Parish of ^{Dio. of Killaloe} ~~Killmorenoe~~ in the Counties of Mayo and Sligo
 do certify that the True and Just Amount of Composition for all Tithes
 whatever, within the Said Parish is Four Hundred and Seventy
Two Pounds Three Shillings and Seven Pence Heg by the year
 of which Sum of £472.3.7. Four Hundred and Twenty Two
Pounds Five Shillings and Eight pence Heg are due and
 Payable to the Rev^d Joseph Verschoyle as a composition for the
 Tithes claimed by him as owner of the Vicarage and Part Rectorial
 Tithes arising out of the General Townlands in the following
 proportions viz to the Whole of the Tithes of the Townlands of upper
 & Lower Belleek, Gurinkee, Kno Sheagh, Cullins, Keash,
 Landdiffy or Cullins, Breafe, Behey, Rathcap or Rathstall,
 Duquashu, Rathmull Jersey & Devon, Duquelaqua, Currimilla
 Anon & Winter, Coalbane, Carrowcushlane, Shanaghy, ~~the~~
~~the~~ Duquelaqua, and Duquemanager. And to the one half being
 the Vicarage Tithes of the following Townlands, Cloonagh,
 Harrinascullague, Kno Sheagh, Kno Sheagh, Kno Sheagh, Cloonick
 -illa Coalcran, Foot Kelly, & Parkes. And that the Sum of
Forty Nine Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Eleven Pence Heg
 is due and Payable to the Rev^d Tho Sullow Rector of Killaloe as a
 composition claimed by him as Part owner of the Rectorial Tithes
 being the remaining moiety of the Tithes of the Townlands herein
 mentioned; And I do further certify that the average Price of oats
 being the Corn principally grown in Said Counties for the Period
 of Seven years ending on the first day of November 1831 is Twelve
 Shillings & Eleven Pence Halfpenny & Barrellastall for the Dublin
