

I, John Henderson Commissioner, duly
 appointed and sworn (under and by virtue of an Act made
 in the Second and Third years of the Reign of King William the
 Fourth) entitled an Act to amend Three Acts, passed respectively
 in the Fourth, Fifth and in the Seventh and Eight years of the
 Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the
 establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland: and to make
 such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and
 just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable
 within the Parish of ^{Dioecesis of Kildare} ~~Killmorenoy~~ in the counties of Wick and Gligo
 do certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all
 Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Four Hundred and
Seventy Two Pounds Three Shillings and Seven Pence Sterg
by the year of which Sum of £472.3.7, Four Hundred and
Twenty Two Pounds Five Shillings and Eight Pence Sterg are
 due and Payable to the Rev Joseph Verschoyle as a Composition for
 the Tithes claimed by him as owner of the Vicarial and Pasto-
 rial Tithes arising out of the several Townlands in the following
 proportions viz To the whole of the Tithes of the Townlands of Upper & Lower
 Belleck Gurintkeel Knockleagh Cullans Reash Lanadiffy
 or Quilens, Brecasy Kehoy Rathcap or Ballytater Duignashew
 Rathmore Linsy & Divson Duignolegan Loumbla Finca & White
 Crostlaon, Carrowcushlane Shanaghy Duignaleck and Dubhy
 & Duignemangan - And to the one half (being the Vicarial) Tithes of
 the following Townlands Cloonagh Yarrinascollogue Knockenello
 Knockegaw, Knockbarrett Cloont Kella Coolcran Cork Kelly & Parks
 And that the Sum of Forty Nine Pounds Seventeen Shillings and
Eleven Pence Sterg is due and Payable to the Rev Thos Sutton Vicar
 of Kildalla, as a composition claimed by him as Past owner of the
 Rectorial Tithes being the Remaining moiety of the Tithes of the Townlands
 hereinbefore mentioned And do further certify that the average
 Price of oats being the Corn principally grown in said counties for the
 Period of Seven years ending on the first day of November 1830
 is Twelve Shillings and Eleven Pence Halfpenny & Barrell as taken
 from the Dublin Gazette, Given under my hand this 25th day September, 1833
