sioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue
of an Act, made in the fourth year of the Reign of
King George the fourth, intuled "An act, to provide
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland for a limited time, to Ascertain and fix a
true and Just Composition, for all tithes arising,
~~arising~~ ~~payable~~ ~~within~~ the Parish of Kilmacoo
in the County of Mayo, do hereby Certify that the
true and Just Amount of Composition for all tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish, is two hundred
Pounds, ^(Eight Shillings and ten pence) by the year, of which Sum of two hundred
Pounds, ^(Eight Shillings and ten pence) one half is due and payable to the Rev^d
Joseph Seymour, as a Composition for the tithe
Claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and
the other half is due and payable to the Lord Viscount
Dillon as a Composition for the tithe Claimable by him
as Lay Impropriator thereof —

And we do further Certify that the average Price
of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such
County for the period of Seven years, ending the
1st day of November 1821, is fifteen Shillings and
two pence farthing per Barrel —
