by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of
the Reign of King George the fourth, intituled
"An act to provide for the establishing of Compositi-
ons for Tythes in Ireland for a limited time" -
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composi-
tion for all Tythes arising, growing, yielded or
payable within the Parish of Kilmaven in the Coun-
ty of Mayo - do hereby Certify that the true and
just amount of Composition for all Tythes
whatever within the said Parish is two hundred
Pounds ^{by eight Shillings and ten pence} of which sum of two hundred
Pounds ^{by eight Shillings and ten pence} one half is due and payable to the Rev.
Joseph Tymon as a Composition for the Tythe
claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish
and the other half is due and payable to the
Lord Viscount Dillon as a Composition for
the Tythes claimable by him as Lay Impro-
priator thereof -
And we do further Certify that the average Price
of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in
such County, for the period of Seven years
ending on the first day of November 1821, is
Fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing
per Barrel -
