

I Joseph Neville Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under the provisions of 2 and 3 William 4th entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 2^d and 3^d and in the 7 and 8th years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all the Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Helmung Stricken in the Diocese of Killaloe and County of Clare do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within that part of said Parish consisting of the Townlands of Doonsallagh, Hillerman, Shanoveagh, Coore, Cloonlakeen, Doonogan, Mount Scot, ^{Doonaghmore} May 9th Lane, Dully East, Dully west, Tomroe Castle, Tomroe Roe, Cennardough, Cloona droon, Clounae, Rinerac, Caegane, Funnuebegs, Funnue moe, Carrulegan, and Mutton Island is Ninety pounds fifteen shillings by the year of which sum of Ninety pounds fifteen shillings the sum of Fifty pounds fifteen shillings is due and payable to the Rev^d John Studdert as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish. and the sum of Forty pounds is due and payable to The Right Hon^{ble} the Earl of Egremont as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Lay Impropriator

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 is one pound twelve shillings and one half penny of Barrell.
