

We Peole Hickman and Thomas Mahon Esqrs duly as-
sented and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made
in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth,
intituled An Act to provide for the establishing of
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited Time, to
ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all
Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the
Parish of Kilmurray Coadralaw, in the County of Clare,
and Diocese of Killaloe do hereby certify, that the
true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever
within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Twenty
five Pounds Sterling by the Year. Of which Sum of
Two Hundred and Twenty five Pounds, One Hundred and
Twenty Pounds are due and payable to Prیدن Scott
Esq: as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him,
as Lay Proprietor of said Parish, and Twenty five
Pounds are due and payable to The Rev James Macken
the Vicar of said Parish.

And we do further certify, That the Average Price
of Oats, being the Com principally grown in such County,
for the Period of Seven Years, ending on the first day
of November, One Thousand eight Hundred and Twen-
ty one, is Fifteen Shillings and Two pence Farthing
per Barrel. Dated this Twenty Sixth Day of April
1824 Twenty Four.
