And I do further certify that the Average Price of Wheat  
being the Corn principally grown in the said County of the City of  
Limerick for the period of Seven Years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of  
November 1830 is One pound ten Shillings & 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> — per Barrell of  
20 Stone — Given under my hand this 3<sup>d</sup> day of June 1833
