

We Thomas Tigh and Richard Ryan commissioners
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an
act made in the fourth year of the reign of King
George the fourth, entitled An Act to provide for
the establishing of compositions for tithes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true
and just composition for all tithes arising, growing,
quitted, or payable, within the Parish of St. Patrick
and County of Westmeath, do hereby certify that the
true and just ^{amount of} composition for all tithes whatever within
the said parish is one hundred and ten pounds by
the year, of which sum of one hundred and ten pounds
the whole is due and payable to John Webb Esq^r
the Lessee of the Vicar Choral of St. Patrick and
Christ's Church Dublin Approprietors of said
parish as a composition for the 4th claimant
by him as Lessee of said approprietors.

And we do further certify that the average
price of oats being the corn principally grown in
said County for the period of seven years ending on the
first day of November 1821 (on) is fifteen shilling
and two pence farthing per barrel.
