Tithe Rent Charge order
In the matter of the Parish of Kilan and Phelan

Chapter one hundred and nine section thirty two.

By the Justices assigned to keep the peace in and for the County of Cork assembled
at a General Quarter Sessions of the Peace Holden at Fermoy in and for the Division of Middleton
in Cork County East Riding on a Monday the Twenty eighth day of June one thousand Eight
hundred and seventy five

Whereas the said William Boyle & Scott is the say improvisor of said parish the
person receiving and entitled to receive the rent charge payable in lieu of the Composition
for all the Improper Tithes within such parish made ascertained and fixed by the
Certificate bearing date the second day of October one thousand Eight hundred and Thirty three
of John D'Alorreell the Commissioner duly appointed in pursuance of the statutes in such
case made and provided by which Certificate the gross amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatever in said parish was certified to be the annual sum of one hundred and fourteen
pounds eighteen shillings and three pence half penny which sum was certified to be due and
payable to William & Scott Esquire the then say Improvisor of said parish each and
every year. And Whereas the said William Boyle & Scott the present Improvisor of
said parish duly caused notices to be affixed and given at the times and in the manner
directed by the statutes in such case made and provided and made application in writing
to the Justices of the Peace at the Quarter Sessions above mentioned to have the average price of
Barley being the grain or Corn in said Certificate mentioned for the preceding seven years
in pursuance of the statutes in that behalf required of and ascertained in order that
the said Composition for Tithes and the Tithe Rent Charge in lieu thereof might be
increased according to such average price as compared with the average price of twelve
shillings per barrel being the price of Barley set forth in said Certificate.

And Whereas the said applicant has appeared in person and by his agent before
the said Justices at such Quarter Sessions and the said notices of application and Certificate
and the Title of the applicant and the average price of Barley as advertised in the Dublin
Gazette for the said period of seven years have been proved. Now the said Justices do
ascertain from the Dublin Gazette that the average price of Barley for the said period of seven
years immediately preceding the date hereof is nineteen shillings sterling for each barrel
