Whereas on the twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four a certificate for the parish of Kilpiper in the diocese of Ferns in Ireland was lodged with the registers of the bishop of the said diocese and now appears and is entered and recorded in the registry of the said diocese in the words and figures following to wit,

" We Benjamin Coates and Henry Douse, commissioners duly
" appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in
" the fourth year of the reign of George the fourth entitled
" An act for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland
" for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just
" composition of all tithes arising growing yielded or payable

Kilpiper " within the parish of Kilpiper in the counties of Wicklow and
" Wexford do hereby certify that the true and just amount of
" composition for all tithes whatsoever within the said parish
" is three hundred and thirty five pounds by the year, of
" which sum of three hundred and thirty five pounds one
" hundred and ninety five pounds are due and payable
" to Bridget Higginbotham as a composition for the tithe
" claimable by her as owner of the rectorial tithe, and one
" hundred and forty pounds is due and payable to Ralph
" Sumner the vicar And we do further certify, that the
" average price of oats, being the corn principally grown in
" such counties, for the period of seven years ending the first
" day of November 1821 is fifteen shillings and two pence
" farthing per barrel And we do further certify, that the
" average amount of the rectorial tithes, taken from documents
" laid before us, appeared to be one hundred and sixty two
