" two pounds ten shillings we have added one fifth, vizt.,
" thirty two pounds ten shillings making in the whole one
" hundred and ninety five pounds. The vicarial tithes, being
" two thirds of the tithes of the parish of Killipe, were in lease
" to John Boland and Patrick Gullen for thirty one years,
" which lease expired on the first of May 1819. We could
" obtain no documents to take the average for four years except
" receipts for the yearly reserved rent of eighty four pounds. and
" the vicarial tithes, being one third, appeared to us to have
" amounted to one hundred and forty pounds per year during
" the same period. Given under our hands the fifteenth day
" of April eighteen hundred and twenty four.

And whereas Bridget Fitzgerald, in the said certificate named,
being a person entitled to a portion of tithes in the said parish of
Killipe as aforesaid, duly appealed to us the Lord Lieutenant in
council, stating among other things, and complaining, that
although it is expressly enacted by the 16th section of said act, that
the amount of the composition shall be calculated upon an average
of all the sums paid or agreed for or adjudged to be paid in such
parish on account of tithes during the seven successive years preceding
the first day of November 1821, yet said Coates and Douse, the
the commissioners, without any evidence before them of the sums
paid, agreed for, or adjudged to be paid for or in respect of
vicarial tithes in said parish during any part of the first four
years of said prescribed period of seven years, and without any
evidence thereof, adopted the rent paid to petitioners by said
Boland in said certificate mentioned, who held said tithes by
virtue of a lease thereof for 31 years which expired in 1819, during
