

said four years as the ground of their computation for said four years instead of the sums paid or agreed for or adjudged to be paid within that period of seven years by the owners or occupiers of land in said parish for and in respect of rectorial tithes, and that in such unwarrantable and unjust course of proceeding they struck the average of rectorial tithes for said seven years at the sum of one hundred and sixty two pounds ten shillings and which appears to be inconsistent with the average of said vicarial tithes at the sum of one hundred and forty pounds per annum, although said vicarial tithes were declared by said certificate to be only equal to one third the amount of the rectorial tithes And whereas notice of such appeal having been duly given to all persons concerned therein, the said appeal, in pursuance of an order duly made and notice duly given for that purpose, came on to be heard by us the Lord Lieutenant and council on the twenty sixth day of July in the said year one thousand eight hundred and twenty four in the presence of counsel learned in the law on behalf of the said appellant, no other persons having appeared thereat and therefore the said appeal and certificate and the matter thereof respectively and such evidence as was offered concerning the premises having been heard and duly considered by us the said Lord Lieutenant and council It is this day, that is to say Monday the twenty sixth day of July in the said year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four ordered and directed by us the Most Noble Richard Marquis Wellesley Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, by and with the advice and consent of his majesty's privy council in Ireland and by us the said privy council, that the said certificate be annulled, and that the entry thereof in the registry of the said diocese be annulled accordingly.
